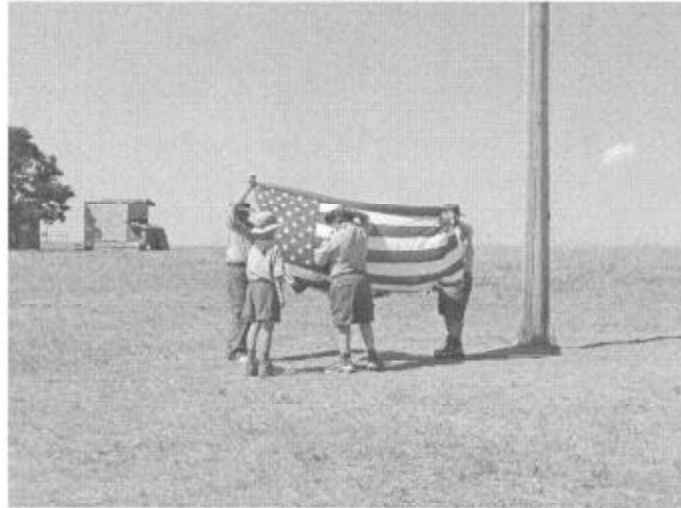


Troop 188 Summer Camp

We complied and have reserved two campsites for fifty (50) scouts and eight (8) adult leaders. Under this current situation we are guaranteed five (5) adult leaders at no charge. If we add one more scout, we will be given another free adult spot.
