Overview of Troop 188's Calendar for 2005-06

Tuesday meetings

- Drop monthly themes in favor of mixing things up some more.
- The subjects picked are similar to previous years, but the order is random.
- Picked more events that were "hands on" and less demonstration.

Weekend events

- This is similar to past years.
- * Tried to eliminate three in a row and minimize two in a row (have too much?)

Patrol Tuesdays and Patrol weekends

- Long discussion on difficulty of having "hands on" meetings with 40+ scouts
- · Scouts decided they'd like to do more patrol based activities,
- But most scouts have busy schedules, extra meetings not practical
- Compromise: Set aside six Tuesdays and four weekends that are for patrols
 - > Patrols pick, organize, and do, with PLC approval, evening or weekend events
 - > e.g., Kayaking, archery, mtn biking, cooking, advancement, paint patrol box
 - On Patrol Tuesdays, they might not meet with troop
 - > They want help (one SA per patrol and a list of activities?)
- To encourage the scouts they would like a "Troop 188 Quality Patrol" award.
 - > We looked at the BSA Honor Patrol award but it failed last year extra meetings difficult, not sure what to do, no support/guidance/coaching
 - > current thoughts: in 6 mo do 3 planned tues mtgs, 1 srv prject, 2 weekends

Advancement

- Scouts want it available but not required
- Second Tuesday of each month, scouts needing 1st class reqs can opt out of the regular program and work on advancement decided on at PLC meeting
- Instruction by adults, troop guide, or senior scouts
- Every other month, troop will sctup a MB on the side, outside of regular program
- Astronomy, Insect Study, four most needed Eagle Mbs for 1st, star, and life scouts

Service projects

- The scouts would like to do six troop wide projects + two patrol projects
- Is 6 too much? 2 @Seas, The Ranch, SFF, Haunted House (OA, Eagle....)
- patrol projects would be part of 188 Quality Patrol award, could be Fagle help

• Summer camp (Major battle)

- Younger scouts want Mountain Man at CLP (they want Jack!)
- Older scouts want something new
- Compromise: Peaceful Valley last week in June this year, CLP next year.

High adventure

- Canoe base middle of July
- A less expensive raft trip some other time during the summer
- Sea base in '07

Fund raisers

- Popcorn, tree pickup, plus one to help defray costs of high adventure
- Scouts would like help setting this up

1) July Committee Meeting Minutes - Approved as submitted

2) Treasurer's report

- a) Beginning Balance \$17510.37
- b) Adjusted Balance w/o Scout Accounts \$11948.04
- c) Adjusted Balance after High Adventure/Summer Camp \$3023.04
- d) Concerns about low funds. Big fundraisers are coming up in the next 4 months. This is the usually the lowest point of the year.
- e) Collected \$85 for the Katrina relief fund at the COH. The money was given to Tim.

3) August Wrap-up

- a) 8/2: Advancement. Most people were already signed off.
- b) 8/9: Prepared for Black Hills
- c) 8/16: Swimming advancement: 7-8 of 22 scouts got signoffs.
- d) 8/23: Orienteering Presentation (went well)
- e) 8:30: Court of Honor went well. Topo and Matt did well for their first times. Rank advancements went too fast. Should talk about what the ranks mean. We should also provide an opportunity to pose the people for pictures. The power point was well done. Matt will bring agendas for other next time so that other people know what will happen.
- f) Oregon Campout: Great trip. Spent \$185/person. \$350 was what we charged the kids. Rich will make a proposal about what to do with the overage.
- g) Annual PLC: Came up with a good calendar and goals. It was a good campout. The kids worked really hard.
- h) Black Hills Trip: Perhaps one of the best trips ever.

i) SEAS Fundraiser – 1.5 service hours. Matt took attendance. The church was very happy (Carl Cicero). They expected to clean up for 3 hours and we did way more than were expected.

4) Eagle Update (Michael D.)

- a) Follow-up on Michael D's eagle proposal that was originally presented at the last meeting. Several questions (listed below) were asked at that time. We followed up on these questions.
- b) Q1: Does the Foodbank need any other work? A1: They don't know.
- c) Q2: Dates? A2: The best dates are in January. There are no food drives in January.
- d) Q3: Can the Foodbank be staffed on the weekends? A3: Don't know. It usually is not.
- e) Q4: Expanded territory? A4: Mike has another Troop if necessary to expand the area.
- f) Norm is concerned about the conflict between Scouting for Food and this Eagle project. Too many similar things in the same neighborhood.
- g) Next Steps: Formal proposal at the next committee meeting.
- h) Michael ages out March 10th, 2006

5) Board of Review Process

- a) Gene has become an ASM. He will no longer be able to give Board's of Review
- b) The proposal is that Gene keeps coordinating the effort but not participating in the actual review. This proposal was ratified. It was also decided that Ken will back up Gene.
- c) There is still process improvement opportunity in that the reviews bunch up in front of the COH. Would like to smooth them out. All agreed.
- d) An issue was brought up that we have not explained the advancement process to the new scouts. We should do the training skits again. AR: SPL to put together training skits at an upcoming meeting to train the newer boys.
- e) Gene will continue to make sure the feedback collected from the COH is given to the Scoutmaster.

6) Calendar Review - Yearly
