Who?

Fort Collins Department of Natural Resources

Zoe Shark – Natural Areas Education and Volunteer Coordinator

What?

Beaver proofing of trees using a sand and paint mixture. The process also involves removing chicken wire that has previously been put up.

Where?

The project will be carried out in a natural area along the Poudre River in Fort Collins. The Natural Resources Department will determine the final location.

When?

I hope to complete the project in April, as all weekends in April currently have no troop activities going on. This project must be done in temperatures above freezing, so the earliest this project could be completed is around mid March. The city requests that at least four hours of work are done, but I would like to do a full day.

Why?

Fort Collins is home to many beavers. In fact the area was originally settled for French fur trade. The beavers are an important part of the Poudre River eco system, but if they had their way, there would be no trees along the Poudre River. Past efforts to save trees along the banks of the river simply involved wrapping trees with chicken wire. The problem with wrapping trees with chicken wire is that often times the beavers can still manage to remove the wire. The wire can also be harmful to other wildlife. The sand and paint mixture is much more environmentally friendly, and beavers have no desire to chew through the covering.

Other Things

Paint/Sand Mixture:

- No, it's not toxic or harmful
- It can be handled by younger scouts
- The mixture is provided by the City of Fort Collins

No power tools or building required!

- Participants will need work clothes

1. December Committee Meeting Minutes – Approved as revised

a. Action Items from last month were reviewed.

2. Treasurer's report

a. Beginning Balance: \$4,571.24b. Adjusted Balance: \$5,693.60

- c. Adjusted Balance after High Adventure/Summer Camp: \$6,923.60
- d. Mr. Canney provide account balances by e-mail prior to next meeting
- e. Mr. Heikes has presented Albertsons \$43.17 and \$2,025 in checks and \$54 in cash to be deposited.
- f. \$1,341 was presented \$780 deposited into bank, \$561 goes to scout accounts
- g. Mr. Urlocker presented 3 more checks for \$600 for San Juan Island trips
- h. Mr. Thull presented \$80 for Lake Powell High Adventure deposit

3. January Wrap-up

- a. January Troop Meetings
 - i. Christmas Tree pickup: \$10.32/hour for each boy that worked, 262 trees were picked up by the troop, boys worked a total of 153 hours. To date \$2,079 were collected \$500 to troop and remainder to the boys. Same algorithm as, over by \$300. Mr. Nash moved that \$500 goes to the Troop and remainder of the amount collected will go to the boys.

 - iii. National Park Event cancelled and now will be Patrol week.

- 4. Fort Robinson Tree Plant Mr. Lancaster is heading up this event. He reported that he is in contact with the administrators and will provide additional information to the troop so we can start to promote. This will be the first scout campout and we anticipate having about 30 scouts. Mr. Lancaster will look into the cost of renting cabins and will send out emails to the troop.
