Note: A short list of Summer Events to Come

Yeh!!! It is Class B time so all you old and new scouters come to the meetings in your Class B uniforms which are your red pull over shirts with Troop 188 logo.

Now here are some events that will be going on during the next few months. This is not the complete list but some highlights. Any up-to-the-moment changes can be found on our troop website at <http://www.troop188.org> .

Relay For Life: On Saturday June 10th we will be helping the Relay for Life at FCHS. This is a fund raiser for cancer research and support for the American Cancer Society. We need scouts for a flag ceremony and for general help. The flag ceremony starts around 11:30.

Gray Rock Backpacking Trip: On June 12th and 13th (Monday and Tuesday) there will be a backpacking trip to satisfy the requirements for camping MB not covered at summer camp. This includes a 4 mile backpacking trip and a 1000 foot vertical hike. We'll leave Monday early, hike in to a meadow, set up camp, climb to the top of Gray Rock, and go back to camp. We'll pack out Tuesday morning and be home before noon.

Northern Tier-Boundary Water High Adventure Trip: July 8th until July 23.
